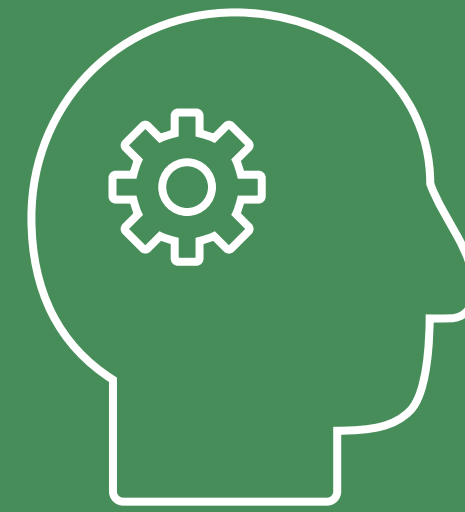

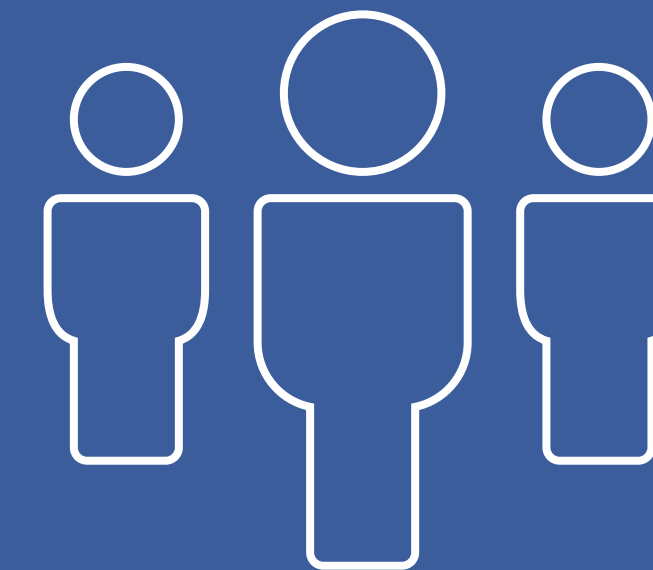
Co-creation of integrated sustainable energy planning and projects – In other words co-creation of a project to mention one, co-planning of integrated sustainable energy planning.

Less distance between public authority decision making and citizens



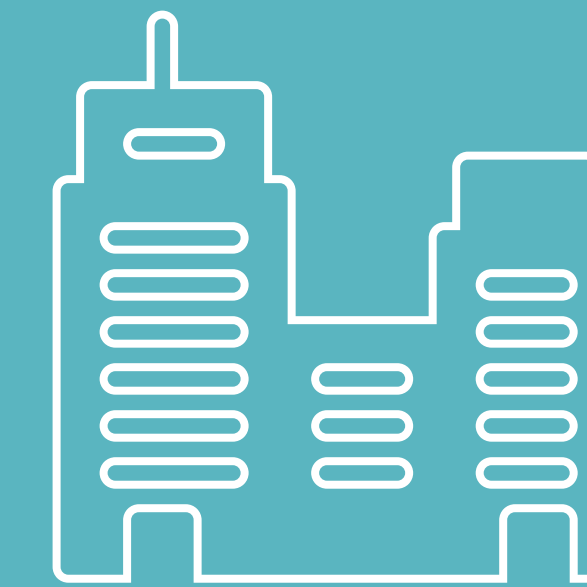
